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Question Prompts

Write (or have participants write) 2-3 sentence answers to the questions below.

Participant Story Questions

REQUIRED QUESTIONS:

- How did your exchange impact you personally, professionally, academically?
- Why are exchange programs important?
- What is a lesson you have learned on your exchange that you are excited to share when you return? (in your neighborhood, town, city, state, country)?
- What was your favorite moment from your exchange?
- Describe any obstacles you had to overcome during your experience and anyone who helped you overcome it?
- What would you say to anyone considering going on an exchange?

OPTIONAL QUESTIONS

- How did you participate in the community (volunteer, attend school, give lectures/talks) during your exchange?
- Describe any obstacles you had to overcome during your experience and anyone who helped you overcome it.
- Tell us about when you felt welcomed by your host family or school.
- What did you expect your exchange experience would be like before you started the program? How does that compare to the actual experience?
- Describe your first interaction or impression of the people in the country where you traveled for your exchange.
- Describe a person you will never forget from your exchange experience.
- What is(was) the first thing you plan to do when you return home?
- What impact has your exchange experience had on your view of the world and other cultures/people?

After having participants answer the questions, you may choose to Write a Story or submit as a Q&A for the website.

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You are also encouraged to write stories about parents of participants or host families.

For Parent Stories

REQUIRED QUESTIONS:

- How do you think your child has benefited from his/her exchange program experience?
 What changes have you noticed from when their exchange began until now?
- Did you have concerns when you learned your child was interested an exchange program? How were these concerns addressed?
- What advice would you give to other parents whose children may be embarking on such a program?
- Why are exchange programs like these important?

For Host Family Stories

Choose host participant type: Host family, volunteer, host organization, employer

REQUIRED QUESTIONS:

- Why did you decide to host an ECA exchange program participant?
- Describe your role as a host. What was a typical day like?
- Why do you think it's important for U.S. citizens to meet people from different countries and cultures? How do U.S. citizens benefit from these exchanges?
- What was the most surprising thing you learned through this experience?
- How has hosting an exchange participant impacted your family and your community?
- Why are exchange programs like these important?

After having participants answer the questions, you may choose to <u>Write a Story</u> or submit as a Q&A for the website.
