➤ Where to Eat/Drink:


- Dumpling Town (hou delicious, cheap, near St. Lawrence Church)

- Transportation: Bus 33 or 22 from Taipa

Taipa Village

- Originally a Portuguese settlement in the 1600s, but now is a charming neighborhood with many restaurants and historical landmarks
- Buses to Taipa Village: 33, 11, 22, 28A, 30
- Walk from campus: 15-20 mins

Exploring the Restaurants in Taipa Village

- **Famous Pork Chop Sandwich Stand:** The most famous sandwich in Macau! Only serves sandwiches starting at 3pm and they only make 300 sandwiches per day. The line is long, but worth it!
- **Café Litoral:** Traditional Portuguese restaurant; specialty is the clams in white wine sauce and African chicken
- **Dumbo Restaurant:** Macanese restaurant; fusion between Chinese and Portuguese food
- **Café Pinnochio:** Macanese food
- **Old Taipa Tavern:** Great place for drinks and snacks during Happy Hour (5-8pm)
- **Frangi's:** Amazing Serradura, traditional Portuguese desert
- **Cucina Italiana:** If you are craving Italian food, this place has amazing thin crust pizza and pasta
- **A Petisqueira:** Traditional Portuguese restaurant
